Within The Stowe Group there are more than 1,400 pupils and over 750 colleagues. The Schools occupy sites of historical significance in Swanbourne (Buckinghamshire), the market town of Brackley (Northamptonshire) and the world-famous landscape gardens at Stowe (Buckinghamshire), where we work with The National Trust to manage 880 acres and open the grounds to over 200,000 visitors a year. Stowe House is open to the public during the School holidays and for guided tours during term time. The Stowe Group is committed to safeguarding and promoting the welfare of children and expects all colleagues to share this commitment. 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Purpose of the job:

To be integral parts of the academic and pastoral communities within the Stowe Group schools. Primary roles are to be part of the schools’ Sports Departments and the pastoral teams supporting the boarding houses.

Key Responsibilities and Accountabilities:

- To promote the aims of the Group at all times with colleagues, parents, pupils and the public
- To play a full part in seven day a week boarding Schools with commitment to teaching, pastoral care, extra-curricular activities and School duties.
- To assist in the recruitment of pupils and to promote the Schools and Departments.
- To provide professional high quality teaching/coaching, with the effective use of appropriate resources and the highest standards of learning and achievement of all pupils.
- To attend all appropriate Health & Safety (COSHH) and Child Protection training issues related to the pupils, Schools and Departments.

Key Tasks

1. Coaching/Management/Administration

- To coach sports as required in the activities programme as directed by the Directors of Sport.
- To attend matches and tournaments as required
- To supervise and run activities.
- To attend INSET for continued professional development
- To give feedback to players to develop their performance and understanding

Key Tasks continued.

- To organise the filming of matches.
- To assist with video analysis, including organising and clipping footage so that it is ready for review
- Ensuring all coaches are able to access the match footage and use it for team analysis and feedback sessions
- To develop links with other Prep and local schools.
- To assist the Directors of Sport in the delivery of the Sports Scholarship programmes.
- To undertake any additional duties within reason as defined by the Directors of Sport and Pastoral Heads.
- To ensure adherence to statutory Health and Safety and Data Protection Legislation at all times.
- To ensure compliance with the current teaching staff handbooks.
- **2. Social and moral welfare of pupils**
- To take responsibility for the educational, social and moral welfare of pupils in the context of Stowe Group's boarding communities.
- Contribute to the pastoral well being of the pupils by being a member of staff on duty in the boarding houses during the evening and overnight.
- **3. Assessments and reports**
- To provide or contribute to oral and written assessments, reports and references relating to individual pupils and groups of pupils.

4. Review and Professional Development

- To keep abreast of developments in his/her sport(s) and its coaching methods in order to maintain a high level of professional competence Staff should also participate in arrangements within the agreed framework for review and professional development, including INSET.

5. Discipline, Health and Safety

- To maintain good order and discipline among pupils and safeguarding their health and safety both on the School premises and when they are engaged in School and other activities elsewhere, within the framework of the Health and Safety Policy documents.
- To adhere to and manage all appropriate Health & Safety legislation, risk assessments and Child Protection training issues.

6. Meetings

- To participate in all meetings which relate to the school curriculum, school organisation and school administration and to attend Chapel, assemblies and other school events as required by the Heads of schools.

7. School Duties

- To undertake the supervision of pupils during breaks, at meal times, in detention, on school journeys and on school premises as required by the duty rota.
- To be accommodated on site as required for the execution of your duties.


