

Steve Ausnit American Worthies Award Recipient

American Friends of Stowe is delighted to bestow *The American Worthies Award* upon Steve Ausnit (Cobham '42) in recognition of his outstanding contributions in the worlds of business and philanthropy.

Mr. Ausnit was sent to Stowe at a time of growing political uncertainty and antisemitism in his home country, Romania. After studying at Stowe, he made his way to the United States and to Harvard. In 1951 he worked with his father and uncle, Max and Edgar Ausnit, to develop the deceptively simple plastic zip fastener that was patented and incorporated into Ziploc bags. He holds 104 patents for re-closable fasteners and zipper bags, and is co-inventor of 61 other patents.

Mr. Ausnit has been honored in Romania for supporting local businesses, schools, and sporting events and has endowed bursaries and scholarships at both Harvard and Stowe. He and his wife live on Manhattan's Upper East Side.

Previous recipients of the American Worthies Award are Peter M.F. Sichel (Cobham '39), Sir John Richardson (Chatham '39) and Harry Gregson-Williams (Chatham '80).
