General information concerning Internal Exams, GCSEs, and A Levels is detailed at the beginning of the booklet together with A Level grade boundaries for both the subjects and individual modules. A more detailed breakdown of subject modules at GCSE and A Level can be found under the various subject headings. With the gradual introduction of linear A levels, it is particularly important to note the differences between these and timings of examinations. The hope is that information provided will enable both you and your son/daughter to understand the results breakdown on results day. The handbook will not provide you with details regarding the course content; this is available in the GCSE and A Level Courses Guides provided in the Third and Fifth Forms, and on the school website.

There is also information on the Post Results Service offered by the board and the School's policy with regard to re-marks and re-sits.

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# **Examinations Sat Throughout The Year**

#### **Third Form**

School examinations will take place during November and June. Pupils can expect examinations in all the principal academic subjects and the results will be published for parents in your son's or daughter's end of term report.

#### **Fourth Form**

School examinations will take place in June in all the principal academic subjects and the results will be published in the end of term report. Controlled Assessments are carried out throughout the year and additional performance tests will be carried out periodically by subjects throughout the year.

#### Fifth Form

Fifth Form Stoics will sit mock examination papers during the Lent Term. Practical and oral examinations, as well as controlled assessment occur throughout the Fifth Form. All subjects will have terminal papers in the Summer Series.

#### GCSEs

GCSE examinations are all sat in the Fifth Form. Almost all GCSE subjects contain elements of controlled assessment. Subjects vary in the number of exams they will sit during the summer of the Fifth Form, however, most will have two written exams.

The Examination Timetable in the Summer term is a long one. Exams begin with the practical and oral components in early May, with written exams beginning in mid May and concluding the last week of June.

#### **Controlled Assessment**

This work is being carried out in varying levels of controlled conditions with the final pieces for submission for some subjects being carried out under exam type conditions (high control) within the classroom. Each subject will vary in the levels of control at varying stages. As such, if parents have any queries regarding individual subjects and the coursework content, they should contact the relevant Head of Department.

#### **Lower Sixth Form**

The Lower Sixth can expect to sit School examinations during the Academic Year. Timings of these school exams will vary for the legacy papers and the new linear A levels and pupils and parents will be advised accordingly. In the Summer term, the new linear A levels pupils will sit school examinations at the end of the term. For the legacy papers that have AS modules, these external exams will be sat during the latter half of May and first week of June with re-sit opportunities will be available the following summer.

# **Upper Sixth Form**

The Upper Sixth will sit School examinations during January. The majority of their A2 modules will occur in June.

Subjects consist of either two or three modules at AS Level and two or three modules at Advanced Level (please see individual subjects for more details).

Public examinations during the Lower Sixth will be sat predominantly in May with some subjects in the first weeks of June. Most AS Level exams occur at the beginning of an exams series with A2 modules in the second half of that series. All exams will be sat in the Summer term.

Whilst individual module grades are important to pupils, it is their overall UMS total that is used to define their grade in a subject. Total UMS marks will add up to a maximum of either 200 or 300 at AS Level and a maximum of 400 or 600 at A Level (made up of the potential 200/300 UMS marks for the A2 modules with total UMS marks carried over from AS modules). In addition, candidates achieving an A in their Advanced GCE (Upper Sixth), who also gain at least 180/200 UMS in their two A2 modules, or 270/300 if they are sitting three modules, will receive an A\* grade. 

#### Linear A levels

Art, Biology, Business Studies, Chemistry, Computer Science, Economics, English Literature, History, History of Art and Physics.

Subjects consist of two or three exam papers sat at the end of the Upper Sixth. In the Lower Sixth year, pupils will have a progress test at the end of the Michaelmas term and a full internal school exam at the end of the Summer term. For the science subjects, there is also a practical endorsement element. This will not contribute to the final grade but appears on the certificates as a separately reported result, alongside the overall qualification grade.

#### **Grade Boundaries**

The UMS system of marks will not apply to the Linear A levels. Total marks will vary from exam to exam. Grade boundaries will therefore vary and appear in the table on the next page once they have been published. At the time of going to print, we have no specific details of grade boundaries.

The written paper requires candidates to respond to an unseen media text, and answer an essay question using a pre-prepared, individual case study. The coursework module requires candidates to investigate an area of media promotion and then create their own production work using film and/or print and/or web-based media, which they then reflect on in a 1500-word written submission. In the Upper Sixth year there is one written paper, sat in the Summer series and again a coursework component. The exam module requires candidates to respond to two unseen media texts, and to answer an essay question using two pre-prepared, individual case studies. The coursework module requires candidates to produce a 2000-word investigative research essay and a linked practical production using film and/or print and/or web-based media.
