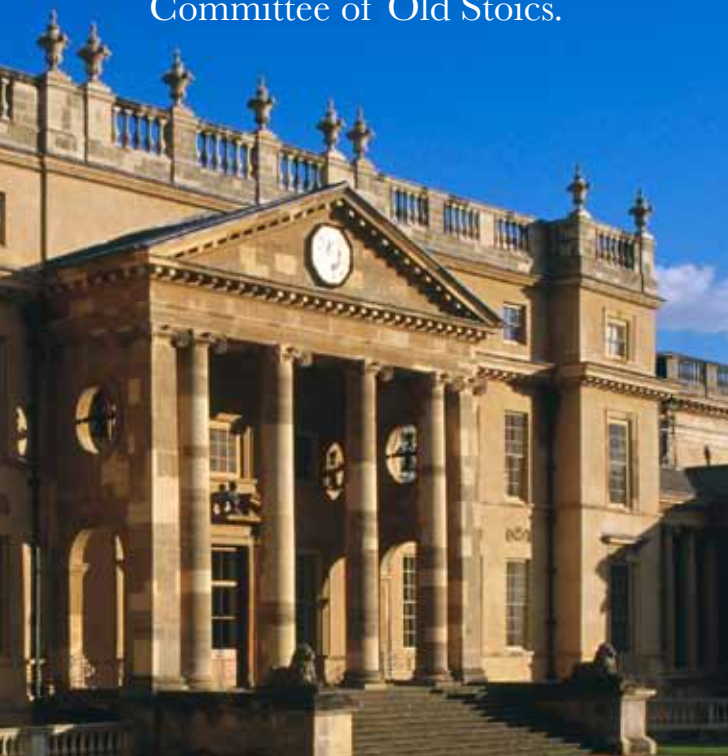

Funding

The costs of promoting the Society's objectives are covered by life subscriptions and income from investments. Life subscriptions are paid in equal instalments over a Stoic's second to sixth terms at Stowe, ensuring that when they leave the School they become fully paid-up life members of the Society. No further subscription is payable thereafter.

The Old Stoic Society makes a lifelong commitment to provide career support to its members, starting with advice and assistance for Stoics and continuing as Old Stoics start on the career ladder.
