# **Art Transportation**

Mr Sonny Moore (Chatham 97) Manager

Sonny grew up amongst artists, designers and architects. Throughout his time at Stowe, Sonny had a keen interest in the arts and he now works as an Art Consultant and Art Logistics Specialist to a wide spectrum of private and corporate clients. Sonny has not always followed a 'traditional' path, and upon leaving Stowe in '97 he worked in the film industry and then

the property market designing interior spaces. Following a belated gap year to Asia and beyond, Sonny returned to the UK to work in the luxury design and visual arts sector. He then did a three year Spatial Design course at Kingston University. Heading up the Art Handling department at AstonSpinks Ltd (www.art-handling.co.uk) and working with his own clients through SMart (www.sonnymooreart.com), Sonny has a good grasp of the visual arts and other creative industries from a creative and business point of view.

# **Fine Art**

Mr George Irvine (Grenville 90) Artist, George Irvine Fine Art Ltd

George's mother was an artist, so he was taught to paint from a young age. At the age of sixteen, whilst still at Stowe, he was the youngest exhibitor at the Royal Academy Summer Exhibition with a large oil painted on card. He left Stowe to do an Art Foundation Course at Oxford Brookes which helped him to amass a portfolio that impressed the Slade School of Fine Art,

UCL. Slade applications were tough, where 600 applicants were whittled down to just 30 lucky candidates. He left Slade a little disillusioned and confused, but took on various commissions and exhibitions. His engagement in 1998 was a catalyst for enrolment in a Post Graduate Certificate in Education (PGCE) at St Luke's College at Exeter University. The course, run by Leslie Cunliffe, was reminiscent of the Foundation Course he had done in Oxford. Teaching suited him and he was soon placed at secondary schools in Bournemouth, Weymouth and Bicester Community College (BCC). After a year at BCC, a position came up at Stowe that he could not resist, and he found himself joining the staff at Stowe, and even more poignant, working alongside his old Art teacher. George left Stowe in 2012 to set up Buttermilk Art School and now focuses on commercial sales, private commissions and tuition via his company George Irvine Fine Art Ltd.





#### Museums Dr Nick Smith (Bruce 93) Archivist, V&A

Nick joined the Victoria and Albert Museum, London, in 2007. As an archivist, he ensures that the Museum complies with its statutory obligations under the Public Records, Data Protection and Freedom of Information Acts and supports research into the history of its buildings and collections. He studied at Lady



Margaret Hall, Oxford (BA in Classics and English, MPhil and DPhil in English Studies 1660-1800) and University College London (MA in Archives and Records Management).

# **Business**

#### **Nuclear - Government & Industry**

Miss Jessica Hollingworth Head of Business Capability, Department for Energy and Climate Change

Jessica graduated from the University of Liverpool in 2011 with a BA Hons in English Literature and Journalism. After graduating, Jessica completed a summer internship at American fashion magazine *Paper* in New York. Her career in nuclear began when

she joined the Babcock International Group Business Graduate Scheme in 2012. Babcock International is the leading engineering support services organisation with a revenue of over £4.5bn in 2015 and specialises in a number of markets; most notably nuclear. The two year scheme allowed Jessica to work on several significant and high value civil and defence nuclear projects in the UK, as well as gaining experience internationally in France and Canada. Upon completion of the Graduate Scheme, Jessica began her 18 month secondment to Her Majesty's Government; working in the Department of Energy and Climate Change on its Nuclear Policy. Based in Whitehall, London she is responsible for ensuring that Government maximises the economic benefit to the UK arising from new nuclear development, simply making sure that UK businesses and people prosper from these nuclear opportunities. Due to the politics, security sensitivities and financial implications surrounding nuclear, this post requires a considerable level of engagement with Ministers in addition to senior members from the nuclear industry; companies such as EDF, Rolls Royce and Hitachi. This role also entails a high level of engagement with international investors; a recent example includes the Chinese State Visit in which nuclear was featured in abundance.

Mr Jonathan Bannister (Walpole 86) Director, Make Happy Ltd

Jonathan Bannister, the Founder of Make Happy, has over twenty years' experience creating advertising, marketing and communications solutions for B2C and B2B clients in Europe and Asia Pacific. Ex of Leo Burnett, Jonathan has a long history of successful communications planning on accounts such as Procter

& Gamble and the Financial Times. Jonathan is a strategic marketer whose passion is to help brands and organisations innovate their business by driving deeper levels of engagement. He currently leads strategic planning at Make Happy and brings his wealth of experience to find the right strategy for their clients. Make Happy works extensively with social enterprises and start ups.

Will spent six years in advertising, initially as a graduate at Saatchi & Saatchi, before then moving 'client-side' to HSBC as the Marketing Director for Central and Eastern Europe and Russia when he was just 29. After a couple of years of red meat and borsch, he returned to the UK to develop brand strategy and new

business development for the mobile company O2. In October 2012, he set up his own strategic consulting firm, Perlin, to help companies evolve their businesses to compete more effectively in these digital times. His client list includes an airline, a pharmaceutical company, a telco, a bank, a fashion house and the BBC.

# **Branding & Automotive**

Miss Hannah James (Nugent 97) Director of Special Projects, Decibel Racing

Following a GAP year in South America with Raleigh International, and four years at Newcastle University (with a year in industry, some of which was spent working for an Orangutan charity in Borneo), Hannah ended up on Sloane Square working for a luxury travel company, Abercrombie and

He joined a Landscape Practice, Land Use Consultants, where he spent thirty years and worked on a wide range of projects in England. He started with reclamation

of sites that had been coal mines in the West Midlands, which gave him a very good understanding of how to calculate large quantities of material. This stood him in good stead for designing the Eden Project in a china clay pit in Cornwall, one of the largest landscape projects of the Millennium.

Dominic's other interest is in conserving and managing Designed Historic Parks and Gardens, such as Stowe. He has been Chairman of the charity, The Garden History Society, for fifteen years and Chair of the National Trust Gardens and Parks Advisory Panel for nine years. He is a strong believer in horticultural education and the encouragement of professional collaboration between the designer and contractor.

# Landscape Design

Dr James Furse-Roberts (Grafton 95) Director, FRLA Ltd

When James left Stowe, rather than going to university, he went to the Royal Botanic Gardens, Kew, where he did a Diploma in Botanical Horticulture. He went on to study for an MSc in Habitat Creation and Management at Staffordshire University. After this, he was approached to do a PhD at the University of Reading on the creation and management of botanic gardens. This provided opportunity to research how financially viable visitor attractions can be created and how space can be designed to convey messages.

He now has his own company, FRLA Ltd, which provides landscape design, masterplanning and interpretation services to natural heritage organisations, including clients such as the National Trust and Oxford's Botanic Garden.

Tom graduated from Exeter University with a degree in Psychology. After a gap year he returned to Jersey to begin his career in finance with Deloitte. He qualified as a professional accountant in July 2013, obtaining his ACA (Association of Chartered Accountants) gualification and consequently becoming

a member of the ICAEW (Institute of Chartered Accountants in England and Wales). Tom transferred to Deloitte London to gain experience in the Investment Management and Private Equity space. Within six months he was offered a role as Finance and Operations Manager at SV Life Sciences Advisers LLP, an investment business specialising in the Biotech, medical and health care sectors.
