Ben 'gutted' at missing out on 3

TO say Ben Duckett was just picking up where he left off last season would not be doing the Northamptonshire youngster's exceptional knock against Sussex justice, but there was a tinge of frustration as well

In a drawn match heavily affected by rain, Duckett hammered a magnificent 282 not out off 367 balls in an innings that lasted eight-and-a-half hours and included 38 fours and two sixes.

It amounted to a fifth century in the last nine County Championship matches for the 21-year-old, who has been a revelation for Northants since being moved up to opener midway through last season.

But it was an injustice that he was not given a chance to become the youngest triple centurion in the history of the Championship due to a sodden outfield, combined with a wet bowler's run-up at the Pavilion End at Wantage Road, wiping out the final two days.

taking the record off a former Northants stalwart, but David Sales' unbeaten 303 against Essex in 1999 still stands.

However, his magnificent knock ranks as the eighth-highest in the county's all-time list.

Northants lost England all-rounder David Willey to Yorkshire during the off-season, but their academy appears to have unearthed another special talent who is piling on the runs at the top of the order.

Duckett said: "I can't forget about how I finished off last season and I'm just trying to take that into this year and play positively. "That's how I got my runs last

season and there are going to be times where I might have people on my back for the shots that I play, but on my day it will come off.

"It hasn't really hit me yet. There was a bit of luck, a few edges over the slips and a couple of drops, but I guess that's got to happen if you're going to get big runs.

"Unfortunately I missed a straight one last week against Oxford MCCU, which can happen, but I went in to play my natural game, be as positive as I can and bat as long as I can."

Northants' big total against the favourites for promotion will be a boost to their confidence - there

were decent totals for captain Alex Wakely and Nottinghamshire loanee Jake Libby as well.

But it is not yet known whether their attack will be good enough to bowl teams out.

While, conversely, Sussex's batsmen will be frustrated not to have had any time at the crease over the four days. Both sides also have injury con-

cerns, with Olly Stone's side strain adding to problems for Steven Crook, Rob Keogh and Rob Newton for Northants.

Meanwhile, Sussex captain Luke Wright was ruled out with an on-going wrist injury he picked up playing in the Pakistan Super League during the winter.

But their head coach Mark Davis played down concerns Wright is set for an extended spell out, saying: "Obviously it is not a great way to start the new season without your captain, but I

think he will be fine. "His back has settled down quite nicely and the medical people feel they can get his wrist sorted quite quickly so we

are not too concerned and, hope fully, Luke will be back for the next game.

It wasn't all about Duckett though with Jake Libby and Alex Wakely both contributing, though we never got the chance to see what the Northants bowlers could do.

For Sussex, who chose to bowl remember, there will be a worry that they couldn't find a way through.

To take just seven wickets across two days, when the pitch looked decent for bowling, will be a worry. They weren't expensive, but 20 wickets are needed to win matches. Teenager George Garton impressed on his Championship debut, being the only bowler to take more than one
